An accomplished author, set and lighting designer, photographer and film director, Chouinard has received several awards and distinctions for her contribution to the arts, including the Governor General's Performing Arts Award for Lifetime Artistic Achievement, the Bessie, the Chevalier of the Order des Arts et Letters in France des, and the Officer of the Order of Canada. Now forty-two years later, Toronto audiences have the rare opportunity to see 24 dance miniatures from her astounding career.

Brilliant, raw and beautifully unsettling, RADICAL VITALITY, SOLOS AND DUETS is an eclectic anthology of three short original works combined with standalone excerpts from historical pieces that Chouinard has reimagined. Interweaving tragedy and comedy, tenderness and cruelty, vulnerability and strength, the graceful and the strange, these works are united by Chouinard's distinctive movement vocabulary. Like in all of her work, these dance miniatures expose the human figure in all its forms.

"We are honoured to have such a longstanding relationship with Marie Chouinard and are thrilled to bring an artist of her caliber to Toronto," says Canadian Stage Artistic Director Brendan Healy. ABOUT MARIE CHOUINARD

Marie Chouinard is the founding president of the Prix de la Danse de Montréal and director of dance at the Venice Biennale. After 12 years as a solo performer and choreographer, in 1990, she formed the COMPAGNIE MARIE CHOUINARD, which has since enjoyed a solid reputation all over the world. An author, artist, stage designer and director, her opus also includes installations, performances, films, photographs, drawings, poems, stories and applications. A true cultural ambassador for Quebec, Marie Chouinard is the recipient of several awards and distinctions highlighting her contribution to the world of the arts, including the Bessie Award (New York, 2000), the Grand Prix du Conseil des arts de Montréal (2006), the title of Officer of the Order of Canada (2007), the title of Chevalier of the Ordre des Arts et des Lettres (France, 2009), the Denise Pelletier Award (Quebec, 2010), the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec Award for best choreography for THE GOLDEN MEAN (*LIVE*) (2012), the Samuel de Champlain Award (France, 2014), the title of Companion of the Ordre national des arts et des lettres du Québec (2015), the title of Chevalier of the Ordre national du Québec (2015), the Governor General's Performing Arts Award for Lifetime Artistic Achievement (Canada, 2016), the Positano "Choreographer of the Year" Award (Italy, 2016) and the Walter Carsen Prize for Excellence in the Performing Arts (Canada, 2016).
